Netball rules

Did you know this rule?

The centre must have 1 foot wholly in the circle when the umpire blows the whistle to restart play after a goal is scored.

The line around the circle is deemed part of the playing area.

The player can have a part of their foot on the line, but not over it.

If you do make contact with the outside of the centre circle then the umpire will call "centre positioned incorrectly". A free pass would be awarded to the opposition where the rule was broken.
